

What is collusion?

Collusion is when students work together inappropriately on individual assessments.

This includes:

- Sharing completed assessments tasks
- Copying from a friend's work
- Submitting similar answers for tasks meant to be completed independently

Ask for ethical help

If you're stuck:

Why it's serious

At UniSQ, collusion is a breach of academic integrity. It could result in:

- A zero grade for the assessment or course
- A reduction in marks for the assessment
- A record of academic misconduct on your student file

How it's detected

UniSQ uses text-matching tools and expert reviews to compare submissions. Similar structure, phrasing, or examples across different students' work can trigger an investigation.
