# CRITERIA OF RR-ADMISSION TO CONSECRE IN 1989

Please note the demand for College accommodation is always very high. Chiefly because of this reason, the Colleges cannot offer any quarantee of re-admission to residents from one year to the other. Your application, however, will be considered on its merit.

The Institute Council, however, has adopted the following criteria for re-admission to Colleges:

- 1. Academic performance of students determined on the basis of results released by the Institute in December 1988.
- 2. As a rule students completing less than 85% of their normal units will have low priority for re-admission.
- 3. Evidence of successful assimilation to collegiate environment and demonstrated personal maturity and respect for College ethics is a pre-requisite for re-admission.

# RESIDENTIAL ACCOMMODATION FOR 1985

At present there are a total of 367 bedrooms available in McGregor, Steele Rudd and Concannon College.

Building of another 30 bedrooms is continuing at Steele Rudd College. The construction is expected to be completed by the beginning of 1989 and the additional accommodation will be available for students next year. The total accommodation at the start of 1989 teaching semester would therefore be at a level of 397 bedrooms.

## EXTENSION OF WARDEN'S OFFICE

The extensions to Warden's Office will start shortly. These extensions will provide additional office accommodation for a Deputy Warden and two computerized work stations for handling residential services including external schools, residential conferences, processing of accommodation applications, generation of financial reports and other management services.

These extensions are expected to be completed by March 1989.
