## ACADEMIC INTERVIEWS WITH RESIDENT FELLOWS

In our Residential Colleges the academic progress of residents is monitored by Resident Fellows.

All students will be assigned to individual Resident Fellows and at least four (4) formal interviews between a student and his/her Resident Fellow will take place during the academic year.

These interviews will be brief, simple, pleasant and supportive. Matters raised in interviews will be academic progress, provision for personal growth, any problems that Colleges could solve and availability of formal tutorials.

These interviews will form the basis for remedial support and tutorial programme.
