START OF ACADEMIC INTERVIEWS

Resident Fellows will monitor residents' academic progress. For this purpose all residents have been assigned to a particular academic group under the guidance of a Resident Fellow.

Formal interviews have already started between the Resident Fellow and individual members of his/her academic group on a one-to-one basis.

The purpose of the interviews is to facilitate communication between students and Resident Fellows and to understand the nature of problems students may face. This information will then be used to help and assist students in need.

Matters raised at interviews may include aspects of the following:

- . Academic welfare and progress
- . Personal and emotional growth
- Opportunities for communication and interaction with others
- Any problems that college could provide help for
- Availability of formal and informal tutorial help.

PLANNING OF TUTORIAL PROGRAMME

As you are aware your colleges run fairly regular tutorial programmes in many disciplines.

Requests for tutorials may be directed to any Resident Fellow. If you have any problem with any unit or discipline, please contact your Resident Fellow.

Please note Residential Colleges run academic tutorials to help students to cope with their studies. Tutorials are run by Institute staff and are held from 7.00p.m. to 9.00p.m. in McGregor and Steele Rudd Colleges. These tutorials are also open to non-residents.

Due to shortness of the initial teaching weeks (only four) regular tutorials will start in McGregor, Steele Rudd and Concannon Colleges after the mid-semester recess. All 1st level students are particularly urged to attend these tutorials.

MID-SEMESTER RECESS

The mid-semester break starts from Saturday, 18 March, 1989. If you have not made arrangments to stay in college during the vacation you would be required to check out on 18.3.89 before 10.00a.m. The Warden's Office will be open on that Saturday for booking-out purposes.

BOOKING-OUT PROCEDURE

- 1. Clear your room of all your belongings. You can use store room for storage.
- 2. Remove all posters and wall hangings.
- 3. Leave your room tidy and place rubbish in bins outside your block.
- 4. Remove bed linen and place it to one side of your room.
- 5. Turn off light and heater switch and close windows.
- 6. Bring your room key to the Warden's Office and sign out.

During your mid-semester break you may store your packed suitcases, etc. in your block store room. Please check with your Resident Fellows which box rooms are to be used for storage purposes.
