## TELEPHONES

All residential blocks of Colleges are provided with a telephone. In-coming calls only from Toowoomba and other areas can be received on these phones, if the caller dials the area code 076 (if necessary) followed by 31 (or 30 in the case of Concannon) in conjunction with the 4 digit number allocated to each block. Please inform your friends and parents of your block telephone number. Except for Concannon College you can dial any extension number within the University Campus by dialling the appropriate 4 digit number.

Residents can make outside calls from public telephones located:

- (1) at the entrance to McGregor College
- (2) outside the Warden's Office (2 telephones)
- (3) in front of C Block Concannon (2 telephones)
- (4) in the corridor between A & B blocks at Steele Rudd College (1 telephone)

## RESIDENTS RESPONSIBILITIES

You are responsible for -

- proper use of College equipment
- conduct of your visitors
- proper dress and conduct in the dining hall

You are required not to:

- generate undue noise
- hold parties without permission
- remove food, cutlery, crockery, etc from dining halls
- invite unpaid guests to the dining hall
- drive cars on the grass or with excessive speed on roadways within the Colleges
- have visitors stay overnight without permission.

## COLLEGE SAFETY

In the interests of your safety and that of fellow residents, please observe the following:

- Familiarize yourself with the location of fire extinguishers in your block and in college generally. (Do not tamper with extinguishers unless an emergency arises)
- Ensure that any electrical equipment you use has been checked and is safe to use.
- Do not smoke in bed.
- Secure your room when at meals, lectures, etc. Do not leave valuables on the desk or in full view of persons passing by.
- Take out an "all-risk" insurance policy on your personal belongings.
- If you observe a safety hazard anywhere in College, please inform the Warden's Office immediately. In particular, report all electrical problems to the Warden's Office immediately. Please do not try to fix it yourself.
