The long-term benefits of a university education are many and can lead to a world of opportunities.

## The benefits of a university education

### Your earning potential goes up

Pursuing a university education is an investment in your future earning potential. Bachelor degree graduates, on the whole, have access to more diverse job opportunities, meaning they're better paid. Those with a bachelor degree currently earn a median weekly wage of \$1500, while people without a qualification only earn a median wage of \$934 a week.\*

This goes up over time, with graduates seeing an 88% increase in their salary in the decade after they finish university.\*

### It's easier to find full-time work throughout your life

The job market can be competitive, no matter your industry. Over the next decade, it's projected that highly skilled technical experts will be even more in demand than they are now. The National Skills Commission recently found that nine out of ten new jobs will require a post-school qualification by 2026.\*\*

As of now, those with a certificate, diploma, or degree are 79% more likely to be employed than those without a qualification. If you have a bachelor degree or higher, you're even more likely to have a full-time job. A degree can give you that extra bit of job security in a constantly changing world.\*

### There are more opportunities to find your path in life

University education not only equips graduates with qualifications, but also provides skills and knowledge relevant and necessary for a future workforce. A degree gives you the space to immerse yourself in an area you're passionate about. This can lead you to interests and careers you never even knew about, which could change the course of your whole life.

## New UniSQ Ipswich building to grow health workforce

UniSQ Ipswich is the region's destination for healthcare education, with increased program offerings, strong community and industry partnerships, and world-leading health research. A new three-storey building, currently under construction and due for completion in 2025, will accommodate the significant growth in School of Health and Medical Sciences students and provide more space for learning, teaching, and research. The new building will bring together the University's teaching and research in key health areas, including occupational therapy, speech pathology and physiotherapy, as well as sport and exercise, paramedicine, nursing and midwifery, and biomedical sciences.

Key features of the new building include:

- technologically enabled, flexible teaching spaces for all programs
- cutting-edge exercise and sporting facilities and equipment
- state-of-the-art PC2 laboratory facilities for medical sciences teaching and research
- dedicated areas for students to connect and collaborate.













# UniSQ Ipswich map











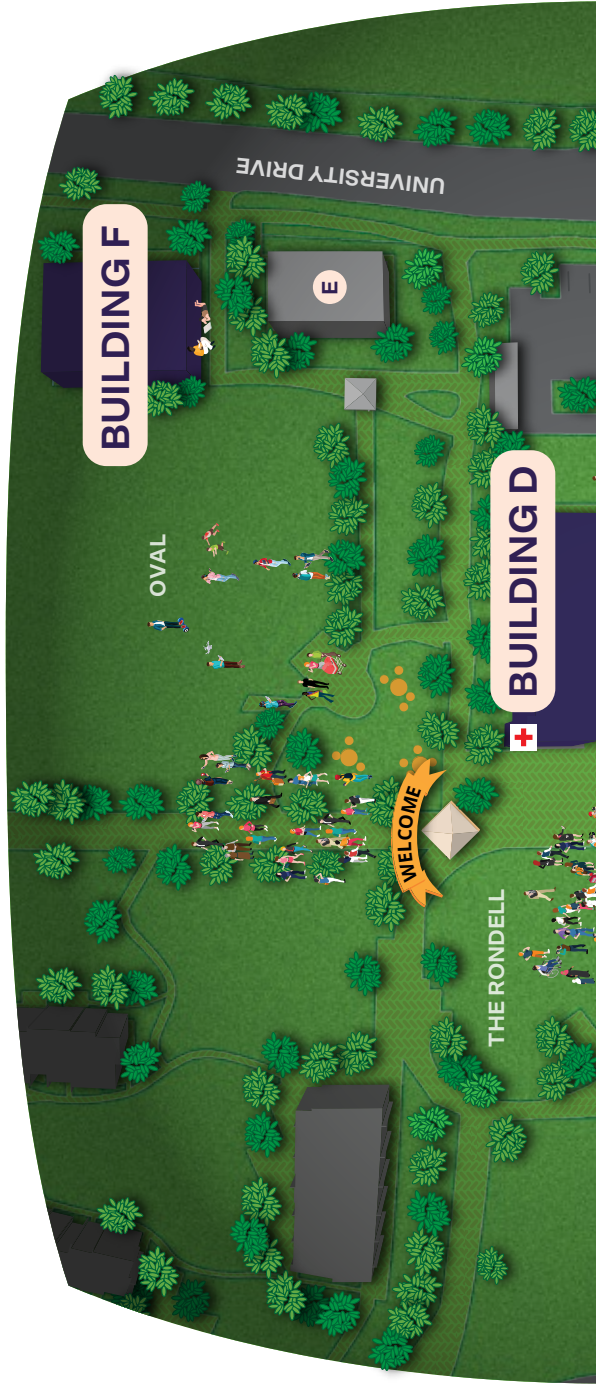
