Your earning potential goes up

Pursuing a university education is an investment in your future earning potential. Bachelor degree graduates, on the whole, have access to more diverse job opportunities, meaning they're better paid. Those with a bachelor degree currently earn a median weekly wage of \$1500, while people without a qualification only earn a median wage of \$934 a week.*

This goes up over time, with graduates seeing an 88% increase in their salary in the decade after they finish university.*

The job market can be competitive, no matter your industry. Over the next decade, it's projected that highly skilled technical experts will be even more in demand than they are now. The National Skills Commission recently found that nine out of ten new jobs will require a post-school qualification by 2026.**

As of now, those with a certificate, diploma, or degree are 79% more likely to be employed than those without a qualification. If you have a bachelor degree or higher, you're even more likely to have a full-time job. A degree can give you that extra bit of job security in a constantly changing world.*
