Professional accreditation

The Human Resource Management major within the Bachelor of Business is accredited by the [Australian Human Resources Institute](#) (AHRI) and satisfies the educational requirements for professional membership of AHRI.

Program aims

The program aims to produce graduates who meet the aims and objectives of both the [Bachelor of Arts](#) and the [Bachelor of Business](#) degree programs.

Admission requirements

To be eligible for admission, applicants must satisfy the following requirements:

Applicants for admission to the Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Business must satisfy the requirements for admission to the [Bachelor of Arts](#) and the [Bachelor of Business](#).

All students are required to satisfy the applicable [English language requirements](#).

If students do not meet the English language requirements they may apply to study a University-approved [English language program](#). On successful completion of the English language program, students may be admitted to an award program.

Program fees

Commonwealth supported place

A Commonwealth supported place is where the Australian Government makes a contribution towards the cost of a students' higher education and students pay a [student contribution amount](#), which varies depending on the courses undertaken. Students are able to calculate the fees for a particular course via the [Course Fee Schedules](#).

Commonwealth Supported students may be eligible to defer their fees through a Government loan called [HECS-HELP](#).

Domestic full fee paying place

Domestic full fee paying places are funded entirely through the full fees paid by the student. Full fees vary depending on the courses that are taken. Students are able to calculate the fees for a particular course via the [Course Fee Schedule](#)

Domestic full fee paying students may be eligible to defer their fees through a Government loan called [FEE-HELP](#) provided they meet the residency and citizenship requirements.

Australian citizens, Permanent Humanitarian Visa holders, Permanent Resident visa holders and New Zealand citizens who will be resident outside Australia for the duration of their program pay full tuition fees and are not eligible for [FEE-Help](#).

International full fee paying place

International students pay full fees. Full fees vary depending on the courses that are taken and whether they are studied on-campus, external or online. Students are able to calculate the fees for a particular course via the [Course Fee Schedules](#).

Program structure

The Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Business double degree comprises 32 units as follows:

Arts Studies

The Arts component shall comprise either:

- at least 12 courses comprising of an eight-unit major plus one 4-unit minor or 4 electives from the [Bachelor of Arts](#), [Bachelor of Communication](#) or (students choosing majors from must contact the Faculty of Business, Education, Law and Arts as not all majors are available in this degree) or
- a 12-unit extended major from the [Bachelor of Arts](#).

At least two units from each major must be at third year level.

Business Studies

The Business component shall comprise an eight-unit discipline-based major chosen from the following majors available within the [Bachelor of Business](#):

- Administrative Management
- Human Resource Management
- Information Technology Management
- International Business
- Management and Leadership
- Marketing
- Supply Chain Management
- Tourism Management.

Required time limits

Students have a maximum of 9 years to complete this program.

Recommended enrolment pattern

The following table indicates the preferred enrolment pattern for first year full-time/on-campus students. External or part-time students should follow a modified pattern.

Students should note the following:

- the Business major starts in Semester 1 of second year
- the first Arts major starts in Semester 2 of first year
- the second Arts major starts in Semester 1 of second year
- the three core courses [CIS1000 Digital Disruption](#)[£], [CMS1000 Communication and Scholarship](#), [STA2300](#) should be taken as indicated below but may be interchanged if there are timetable problems
- three of the Business core courses should be taken in Semester 1.

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Students may complete all core Business courses ONC at Toowoomba or Springfield campuses. The Marketing, Human Resource Management and Tourism Management majors are fully available at Springfield campus. Selected courses from the other majors from the [Bachelor of Business](#) are available at Springfield campus.
