Program objectives

On successful completion of the Academic Communication Skills program, students should be able to demonstrate:

- (1) Communicate in English with fluency and spontaneity with minimal searching for expressions in integrated academic contexts, at an advanced level.
- (2) Comprehend a wide range of demanding, longer English texts and recognize implicit meaning, at an advanced level.
- (3) Apply the English language flexibly and effectively for a range of purposes and with a wide range of topics, at an advanced level.
- (4) Produce clear, well-structured and detailed integrated text in English on complex subjects, showing controlled use of organizational patterns, connectors, and cohesive devices, at an advanced level.

Admission requirements

To be eligible for admission, applicants must satisfy the following requirements:

- **Resident status:** students on international student visas, or students from non-English speaking backgrounds residing in Australia.

- **Minimum academic requirements:** completion of senior secondary schooling in the home country, *or* completed Year 12 in an Australian High School *or* completed 'A' levels, *or* mature-age entry.

English language entry requirements

Placement in the program is determined by results of an international English language test. Students will be placed in an appropriate level according to results on the test.

Program fees

International full fee paying place

Commonwealth supported fee exempt places

- holders of a Permanent Humanitarian Visa (and resident in Australia)

Program structure

Students enrol in the different Academic Communication Skills (ACS) levels based on results of a recognised English language test. The program has 3 levels which students undertake successively. Progress to the next level is predicated upon success in examination and assignments.

Program completion requirements

Students wishing to apply for direct entry into undergraduate and postgraduate degree programs must meet the [approved pathway and foundation program proficiency requirements](#). Students failing courses in the Academic Communication Skills Program or not meeting the grades requirement for entry are required to retake the course and seek recommendations from the Program Director regarding a suitable pathway to gain entry to degree studies.

Program articulation

Articulation can occur:

- From - EAP 2 to ACS 1 to [Category 3](#) programs
- From ACS1 to [Category 3](#) programs
- From ACS 1 (Requires 70% minimum final grade) to ACS 2.
- From ACS 2 to ACS 3 or [Category 4](#) programs
- From ACS 3 to [Category 5](#) programs.

Required time limits

Standard duration of the on-campus program is a minimum of 10 weeks and a maximum of 30 weeks.

Each level of ACS is designed to further advance your academic English language skills and ensure you are prepared to integrate effectively in an Australian academic setting.

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Program aims

The aim of this program is to provide language preparation for tertiary study based on the personal and intellectual transition required by students to succeed in higher education in the Australian context. It aims to develop linguistic and academic English skills to prepare students to participate in the UniPrep program. It provides this transition for students not fully prepared academically or requiring a higher level of English for tertiary study. The program will offer a pathway to UniPrep.

Program objectives

On successful completion of this program, students will:

- (1) have developed their reading skills to an intermediate level, suitable for introductory academic courses
- (2) have developed the ability to comprehend straightforward academic texts
- (3) have developed their academic writing skills to an intermediate level, suitable for introductory academic courses
- (4) have developed the ability to write straightforward connected texts
- (5) demonstrate an understanding of how to use academic texts to write academic material.

Australian Qualifications Framework

The Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) is a single national, comprehensive system of qualifications offered by higher education institutions (including universities), vocational education and training institutions and secondary schools. Each AQF qualification has a set of descriptors which define the type and complexity of knowledge, skills and application of knowledge and skills that a graduate who has been awarded that qualification has attained, and the typical volume of learning associated with that qualification type.

This program is at AQF Qualification Level 04. Graduates at this level will have theoretical and practical knowledge and skills for specialised and/or skilled work and/or further learning.

Admission requirements

To be eligible for admission, applicants must satisfy the following requirements:

- Students from non-English speaking backgrounds resident in Australia.
- **Minimum academic requirements:** enrolled in Year 10 or 11 in a partner school and an IELTS of 4.5 or equivalent.

English Language entry requirements

Placement in the program is determined by results of an English language placement test. Students will be placed in an appropriate level Pre-Intermediate or Intermediate according to results on the placement test.

Program fees

Commonwealth supported fee exempt places

Domestic students who meet the below citizenship and residency requirements are eligible for a Commonwealth supported fee exempt place:

Program structure

Students enrol in ELDS levels based on results of a recognised English language test or the UniSQ College administered placement test. The program has 2 levels which students undertake successively. Progress to the next level is predicated upon success in assessment.

Program completion requirements

To successfully complete the program and be recommended for the UniPrep program students must successfully complete Intermediate level and/ or demonstrate an English language proficiency level equivalent to IELTS 5.5.

Required time limits

Students have a maximum of two sessions to complete the program.

Core courses

Students must complete at least one of the following courses:

- [ENS0002 Pre-Intermediate English Language \(10 week\)](#) (2 units)
- [ENS0003 Intermediate English Language \(10 week\)](#) (2 units)

Each level of ELDS is designed to improve English language proficiency. The outcome of this element is measured using a progress assessment. Another key element is the development of learner independence and other academic skills. The outcome of this element is measured through classroom activities and assignments.

The program will be offered with partner schools within class or online, across two sessions. Students will be enrolled according to their language proficiency level.

On successful completion of the English for Academic Purposes program, students should be able to:

- (1) Communicate using the English language in clear, simple, and connected spoken and written texts on familiar integrated academic content, with support at an emerging independent level.
- (2) Comprehend aural and written Standard English in structured integrated academic texts on familiar topics with some confidence, with support at an emerging independent level.
- (3) Apply the English language with support at an emerging independent level on familiar academic topics across a range of simple academic spoken and written genres.
- (4) Produce simple integrated academic texts in English on familiar topics for a range of academic purposes, showing routine use of organisational patterns, connectors, and cohesive devices with accuracy at an emerging independent level.

The Certificate of English for University Studies aims to develop students' capacity to manage information, build knowledge and communicate ideas more independently at an advanced level in English in both spoken and written forms, with a specific focus on enhancing academic English language skills to meet the more complex communication demands of tertiary studies in particular professions. English language proficiency is benchmarked at Pearson Test of English Academic (PTE) 58 and the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) level C1.

Program objectives

- (1) Develop students' capacity to prepare for and complete an internationally recognized test of proficiency in English language, at a level comparable to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) Level C1, which meets requirements for future professional registration.
- (2) Develop students' capacity to comprehend and produce spoken texts clearly and appropriately in English at an advanced level for fluent and spontaneous professional dialogue.
- (3) Develop students' capacity to manage written information, think critically, and build knowledge in English at an advanced level to meet the complex communication demands of tertiary studies for particular professions.
- (4) Develop students' capacity to communicate effectively in appropriate written and oral forms at an advanced level of communicative competence which meets acceptable requirements for professional purposes and audiences.

Admission requirements

To be eligible for admission, applicants must satisfy the following requirements:

Completion of senior secondary schooling in the home country or equivalent, or Year 12 in an Australian high school.

Normally, to be eligible for enrolment in the program a person will have attained an age of at least 18 years in the year of the proposed enrolment.

Students will need to complete the online application form for entry to the program.

All students are required to satisfy the applicable [English language requirements](#).

If students do not meet the English language requirements they may apply to study a University-approved [English language program](#). On successful completion of the English language program, students may be admitted to an award program.

- (3) Develop students' capacity to manage written information, think critically, and build knowledge in English at a near native-like level to meet the complex communication demands of tertiary studies for particular professions.
- (4) Develop students' capacity to communicate effectively in appropriate written and oral forms at a near native-like level of communicative competence which meets acceptable requirements for professional purposes and audiences.

Admission requirements

To be eligible for admission, applicants must satisfy the following requirements:

Completion of senior secondary schooling in the home country or equivalent, or Year 12 in an Australian high school.

Normally, to be eligible for enrolment in the program a person will have attained an age of at least 18 years in the year of the proposed enrolment.

Students will need to complete the online application form for entry to the program.

All students are required to satisfy the applicable [English language requirements](#).

If students do not meet the English language requirements they may apply to study a University-approved [English language program](#). On successful completion of the English language program, students may be admitted to an award program.
